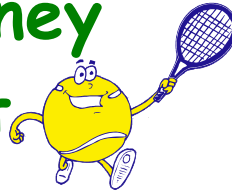

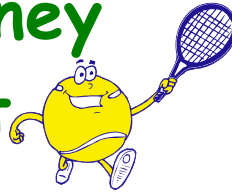

Conditions of Court Usage

- Everyone is welcome and encouraged to use the Farrington Gurney Tennis Court, which is managed for the benefit of the local community by the "Tennis Court Sub-Committee" of the Farrington Gurney Memorial Hall Committee.
- Access to the court is available either by:
 - i) "Pay as You Play" via the Booking Secretary
 - OR
 - ii) "Court Membership" on payment of an annual court membership fee.The membership year runs from 1st April through to 31st March.
There are 3 classes of membership - Family, Single & Junior.
- The court gate is fitted with a padlock. "Pay as You Play" users collect a padlock key from the Booking Secretary and return it to him immediately on vacating the court. Subject to the booking rules below, "Court Members" have unlimited access to the court via a court key which is issued to them on payment of the membership fee.
- Parents/guardians of junior players take responsibility for ensuring compliance with all conditions of court usage (see Memo for the Parents/Guardians of Junior Members/Players).
- The Court is available for play seven days a week. A maximum of two advanced bookings may be made. Telephone the Booking Secretary who will confirm court availability and reserve the court.
- All booking requests must be made before 9pm in the evening to Mr Dave Bury, the Booking Secretary - phone 01761 452479. Weekend play should be booked in advance on a weekday. Mr Bury's address is "February Cottage", Number 1, Kingston Terrace, Main Street, Farrington Gurney, (see sketch map illustrating Mr Bury's address in relation to the court).

Conditions of Court Usage (cont'd)

- "Court Members" do not have to book, but, if they do not they must give way and vacate the court immediately should other players arrive who have booked to play (whether "Pay as You Play" users or other Court Members). Booking is thus strongly recommended for all players.
- Guest players accompanying Court Members must pay the "Pay as You Play" court fee (i.e. £3.00 per person per 1½ hour session)
- Sports bags should be stowed in the corners of the run-off area to minimize tripping hazards. Bicycles & other potentially obstructive personal effects are not allowed within the court.
- Appropriate tennis footwear is to be worn at all times on the court i.e. proper tennis shoes or white-soled sports shoes, without ridges on the soles. (*Sports shoes with ridged soles and sports shoes with black soles are not permitted as they damage the court surface*)
- Net height should be checked when setting up for play, correct height being 3ft at the centre of the net. There is a 3ft mark on the 'measuring broom', which is kept on the western boundary fence of the court.
- Please do not over-tighten the net with the net-post winding handle and DO ensure you release the net tension, by unwinding the handle, before you leave the court.
- Do not remove the net adjuster (tape & weight) from its position in the centre of the net - it is there to maintain proper net height & tension.
- Flood Lighting is available if necessary via a token operated meter until 9.00pm. Each £3.00 token buys 1½ hours lighting (subject to the 9pm switch-off over-ride). Tokens can be purchased from the Booking Secretary, Mr Dave Bury (see address above).
- Please take all your litter away with you.
- Please report any damage or problems encountered to Mr Bury, the Booking Secretary.
